

## Entering NKMA Allergies for Nursing, Meaningful Use Requirements

Meaningful Use requires that we specifically review the **MEDICATION Allergy History** of all patients separate from other types of allergies they might have. Follow the steps below to enter allergies correctly:

1. If the patient has absolutely No Allergies of any kind, click the **No Known Allergies** Button, provide the Info Source and click OK. NKA will display:

2. If the patient has an allergy to either food or environmental items but no medication allergy of any kind, click **No Known Medication Allergies** button, provide the Info Source and click OK. No Known Medication Allergies will display.



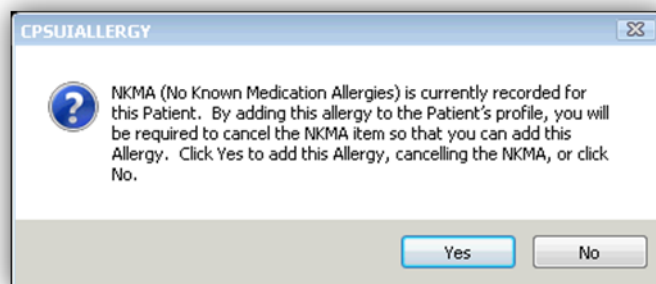
